*In 2015, Texas had over 800,000 confirmed cases of child maltreatment.

National Child Abuse & Neglect Data System

- *Twenty-six percent of these victims were less than one year old.
- *162 died from maltreatment.
- *Approx. 60% of the victims who survive maltreatment end up in the child welfare system.
- *Waller County, Texas averages 60 children in the foster care system yearly.
