NOTICE OF APPLICATION AND PRELIMINARY DECISION (NAPD)
FOR LAND APPLICATION OF SEWAGE SLUDGE PERMIT

MAJOR AMENDMENT

PERMIT NO. WQ0004518000

APPLICATION AND PRELIMINARY DECISION. K-3 Resources, L.P., P.O. Box 2236, Alvin, Texas 77512, has applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) for a major amendment to TCEQ Permit No. WQ0004518000 to authorize increasing the acreage and adjusting the loading rates. The draft permit authorizes the land application of wastewater treatment plant sewage sludge, water treatment plant sludge, and domestic septage for beneficial use on 277.3 acres. This permit will not authorize a discharge of pollutants into water in the state. TCEQ received this application on July 9, 2019.

The sludge land application site is located at 9458 Farm-to-Market Road 362, Brookshire, in Waller County, Texas 77423.

The sludge land application site is located within the drainage basin of Bessie's Creek in Segment No. 1202 of the Brazos River Basin.

The TCEQ Executive Director has completed the technical review of the application and prepared a draft permit. The draft permit, if approved, would establish the conditions under which the facility must operate. The Executive Director has made a preliminary decision that this permit, if issued, meets all statutory and regulatory requirements.
